Social media training successes

Local businesses and communities learning how it's done

Around 40 people from the geopark area have been participating in social media training (online) since mid-July. About half are local business owners wanting to better promote their services (hospitality, crafts, publishing, etc). Others are local community development representatives keen to be more effective reaching out to their communities.

Trainer Barry Murphy has just completed 3 of the 4 phases – i) Introduction; ii) Facebook (+ Instagram & Twitter) and marketing; and iii) Weekly group Q&A / mentoring sessions. Each session has been recorded and made available on YouTube, allowing participants to dip in and out as time permits. The final phase is a monthly Q&A link-up from October through to February 2021.

Informal participant feedback has been very good, typical of this quote: "I've benefited greatly from the course, and am now much more confident in my social media postings and advertising - 'going forward' as they say!". The participants will form the basis for setting up **networks of local businesses** and of community development councils. A full assessment will be done at course end, including on further training needs.

A JCWL Heritage Network created

Show-casing the rich culture and heritage in the geopark area

A new heritage network has been created with representatives from most communities and local historical societies in the geopark area. It emerged from discussions with locals interested in cultural and heritage ideas. The aim of the network is to support and engage the diverse communities of the region, improve information flow and promote heritage events organised by the various local organisations. A great example of the potential for this network was the

recently prepared National Heritage Week (NHW) 2020 collection. Consisting of 7 articles (1 bilingual EN/IR), it tells the stories of how Loughs Carra, Mask and Corrib have shaped the communities living on their shores. During NHW 2020, each article was shared on the project facebook page (1 per day), generating great interactions. The full document is published on the Heritage Week website here and will be available to download from our new website. Mindfulness course

Enhancing well-being

'Introduction to Mindfulness' courses are being offered by JCWL GeoEnterprise (the organisation representing the geopark communities in the project). The courses are an experiential introduction to the skills of Mindfulness with a view to integrating them into people's daily lives. It will be a shared and collaborative learning journey with members from other communities within the geopark area. The courses will run for 6 weeks online and will include all course material as well as audio recordings of Mindfulness practices. Suitable for those over 55 years. The course tutor Suzanne Mulqueen holds a Postgraduate Diploma in Mindfulness and is certified by, and affiliated to, the Mindfulness Association. Course 1 dates: Oct 6, 13, 20, Nov 3, 10, 17. The same courses are also available January to March, and April-May 2021. Cost €40. Places are limited, so be in quick.
